- What is English Second Language?

A basic introduction to the English language. Primary emphasis for all grades is on developing skills in oral communication. In addition, students in grade 3 to 6 are introduced to reading and writing in English as a second language of instruction.

- What can I do to help my child in English Class (Homework & Long Term)?

Grades 3 to 6 use the textbook 'Chatterbox' on an occasional basis. Themes are followed but courses are adapted.
